Unit Nine: Research Workshop

In order to develop research skills, students plan research, develop relevant research questions use library and media center resources, and collect data. Students also evaluate information and sources, including nonfiction books, periodicals, and Web site. Students write a research report, formulate a major research question, locate and evaluate sources, and take notes. Students prepare a source list, summarize and paraphrase, and quote directly and avoid plagiarism. Students present clear and accurate perspectives on the topic, document sources and prepare a Works Cited list, and choose complex sentences to signal different relationships. Finally, students create a Wiki.
